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Firearms Training Course:


The initial firearms training course shall consist of twelve (12) hours of instruction by an approved firearms instructor. (A list of approved instructors may be found in the CCW application packet). The course shall include, at a minimum, California Law governing concealed carry, instruction in firearm safety, safe storage, conflict avoidance, de-escalation techniques, the proper exercise of deadly force and liability. CCW applicants are also required to demonstrate safe firearms handling and a basic level of proficiency with each firearm they intend to carry. (See qualification standards below)

Permit holders are required to renew every two (2) years. Prior to renewal, and no later than 90-days after permit expiration, Permit holders shall attend a four (4) hour course of instruction. This renewal course shall reinforce, at a minimum, the key points of the initial course and cover any changes in California Law. Permit holders must also requalify with each firearm they wish to carry concealed. Permit holders may add or delete firearms to their permit at this time.

Permit holders wishing to add a firearm to their permit before their current permit expires may do so at any time. The permit holder shall first demonstrate they can safely manipulate the firearm, pass the standardized qualification and be certified by an approved firearm instructor.

Firearms Qualification:

- The Standard Qualification course is **10** rounds fired at a standard or equivalent of a B-27 full-size target, at **7-yards**, from a “low-ready” position, strong-hand supported.
- Successful qualification will be a total of **8** rounds out of **10** inside the “**9**-ring,” or **80%**.
- Qualification is conducted with the guns(s), maximum of 3, the applicants desires to carry on his or her CCW permit.
- A record of qualification, to include, make, model, and serial number of each firearm shall be submitted by the firearms instructor with the course completion certificate. This information may be on a separate form or printed on the certificate of completion.
- The Red Bluff Police Department will also accept the qualification standards mandated by Butte and Shasta County.
